RESOLUTION NO. 10-01

WHEREAS, the Gage County Board of Supervisors has a duty to construct, renovate, remodel, furnish, equip, add to, improve or provide suitable rooms and offices for the accommodation of the several courts of record and to keep such

accommodations in repair pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-120; and

WHEREAS, in addition to that duty, the Gage County Board of Supervisors recognizes the historical significance of the Gage County Courthouse as it has served as the location for the administration of local government and institutions for Gage County for over 100 years and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places; and

WHEREAS, the Gage County Board of Supervisors finds that both the District and County courtrooms in the Gage County Courthouse are in need of repair and renovation; and

WHEREAS, a renovation project approved by the voters of Gage County is in progress in the Gage County Courthouse and that project required the judges of both courts to vacate their courtrooms and utilize alternate facilities because of the extent of the work being performed in their courtrooms. As a result, the Gage County Board of Supervisors has determined that repairing and renovating those spaces at this time is the most economically feasible long term solution and would prevent future disruption of the work of the judiciary in Gage County; and

WHEREAS, the Gage County Board of Supervisors recognizes that renovating the courtrooms involves restoring historically significant architectural features including ceilings and floors and the construction of furnishings and benches to match those fixed features and that the work involved requires unique skills, abilities, and experience; and

WHEREAS, Ratigan-Schottler Manufacturing has submitted a proposal for furnishings in the district courtroom, incorporated herein as Attachment #1, and has discussed recommendations and options for the restoration of the floor and ceiling in both courtrooms. The Gage County Board of Supervisors recognizes that Ratigan-Schottler Manufacturing is a respected business located in Beatrice, Gage County, Nebraska, which possesses the unique skills, abilities, and experience necessary to complete the work and has substantial experience renovating courtrooms; and

WHEREAS, the Gage County Board of Supervisors has been made aware that there may be private funds available to defray the cost of renovating the courtrooms; and

WHEREAS, this matter was discussed at an open, published and public hearing on January 27, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the Gage County Board of Supervisors has properly published and has placed on its agenda the issue of approving or disapproving this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE GAGE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HEREBY RESOLVES to adopt the proposal of Ratigan-Schottler Manufacturing of Beatrice, Gage County, Nebraska, incorporated herein as Attachment #1, and finds that the renovation of the courtrooms involves unique services that are offered by that corporation;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Gage County will accept private funds to help cover the cost of renovating the courtrooms in the Gage County Courthouse.

(c) All objections or other comments relating to the issuance of the Bonds have been heard and have been duly considered by the Board in connection with the adoption of this Resolution.

(d) (1) A general functional description of the type and use of the project (the same being to pay the costs of roofs, windows, HVAC repairs and re-

placements, remodeling of living facilities and other deferred maintenance items on the Borrower's Beatrice campus, 722 South 12th Street, Beatrice, Nebraska) has been accurately described in such notice of hearing and is hereby approved; (2) the maximum face amount of the Bond has been accurately described in such notice of hearing and is hereby approved; and (3) the initial owner, operator or manager of such facilities has been accurately described in such notice of hearing and is hereby approved.

As security for the Bond, the Issuer will pledge the payments to be received under the Loan Agreement to the Purchaser. The principal or redemption price of and interest on the Bond are payable solely from the amounts to be paid under the Loan Agreement and otherwise as provided in the Loan Agreement and nothing in the Bond or the Loan Agreement shall be construed as pledging any other funds or assets of the Issuer. The Issuer shall not, in any event, be liable for the payment of the principal or redemption price of or interest on the Bond or for the performance of any pledge, obligation or agreement undertaken by the Issuer except to the extent that money pledged under the Loan Agreement is sufficient therefore.

The Bond will be a special, limited revenue obligation of the Issuer. The Bond shall not be deemed to constitute an indebtedness, liability or general obligation of the Issuer, the County, the State of Nebraska (the "State") or any political subdivision thereof within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory provision or a pledge or loan of the faith and credit of the Issuer, the County, the State or any political subdivision thereof. None of the Issuer, the County, the State or any political subdivision thereof shall be obligated to pay the principal or redemption price of or interest on the Bond except from the special funds pledged therefore, and neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power, if any, of the Issuer, the County, the State or any political subdivision thereof is pledged for the payment of the principal or redemption price of or interest on the Bond or any other costs incidental thereto. None of the County, the State or any political subdivision thereof shall in any event be liable for the payment of the principal or redemption price of or interest on the Bond or for the performance of any pledge, obligation or agreement undertaken by the Issuer.

Section 3. The approval granted hereby is solely and only for the purpose of satisfying the requirements of Section 147(f) of the Code. Such approval is not intended, nor should it be construed to be, final approval of the issuance of the Bond or a commitment of any kind on the part of the County or any official or officer thereof to issue the Bond. The approval granted hereby is not intended, nor should it be construed to constitute, any review or approval by the County or any official or officer thereof of the credit of the Borrower, nor any type of guaranty by the County or any official or officer thereof of repayment of all or any part of the Bond.

Resolution No. 10-09

Whereas: Gage County has a full-time public employee on staff, or has obtained the services of a full-time public employee who is fully qualified and has the time and interest in serving as a “Responsible Charge” (RC) for this project. The designated RC will be in day-to-day responsible charge of all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, with the express purpose of doing all things necessary for the project to remain eligible for federal-aid transportation project funding; and

Whereas: the RC will ensure that, at a minimum, (1) the project receives independent and careful development, supervision and inspection, (2) the project is constructed in compliance with the plans and specifications, (3) all aspects of the project, from planning through construction activities, including all environmental commitments, remain eligible for federal funding, and (4) decisions made and actions taken for the project have adequate supporting documentation filed in an organized fashion.

For purposes of this resolution, the following definitions will apply:

Fully qualified means a person who has satisfactorily completed all applicable Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) training courses and who has met the other requirements necessary to be included on the NDOR list of qualified Local Public Agency (LPA) RC’s.

Full-time public employee means a public employee who meets all the requirements and is afforded all the benefits of full-time employees as that phrase is applied to other employees of the employing public entity. A person is not a full-time public employee if that person provides outside private consulting services, or is employed by any private entity, unless that person can prove to NDOR in advance, that employee’s non-public employment is in a field unrelated to any aspect of the project for which federal aid is sought.

Public employee means a person who is employed solely by a county, municipality, a political subdivision; a Native American tribe; a school district; another entity that is either designated by statute as public or quasi-public; or an entity included on the list of entities determined by the NDOR, and approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), as fulfilling public or quasi-public functions.

Responsible charge means the public employee who is fully empowered by the LPA and has actual day-to-day working knowledge and responsibility for all decisions related to all aspects of the federal-aid project from planning through construction project activities, including all environmental commitments. The RC is the day-to-day project manager, and the LPA’s point-of-contact for the project. Responsible charge does not mean merely delegating the various tasks; it means active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, making decisions, and actively monitoring project construction. It is understood that the RC may

delegate or contract certain technical tasks associated with the project so long as the RC actively manages and represents the owner's interests in the delegated technical tasks.

Be It Resolved: by the Board of Supervisors of Gage County that:

Marlin Kliewer, Highway Superintendent is hereby designated as Responsible Charge (RC) for pre-construction and construction phases, in accordance with the Project Program Agreement previously executed, the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects, and all Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines for the following Federal-aid transportation project:

NDOR Project Number BRS-3265(5),

NDOR Control Number 12299,

In Wymore.

Gage County assures and agrees that:

- 1) It has authorized and fully empowered the RC to be in day-to-day responsible charge of the subject federal-aid project; this does not mean merely supervising, overseeing or delegating the various tasks, it means active day-to-day involvement in the project including identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making.
- 2) The RC is a full-time employee.
- 3) The RC is fully qualified and has successfully completed required training to serve as a RC.
- 4) It will allow the RC to spend all time reasonably necessary to properly discharge all duties associated with the project, including ensuring that all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, remain eligible for federal-aid highway project funding.
- 5) It will not assign other duties to the RC that would affect his or her ability to properly carry out the duties set out in this agreement.
- 6) It will provide necessary office space, materials and administrative support for the RC.
- 7) It will fully cooperate with, support and not unreasonably interfere with the day-to-day control of the RC concerning the acts necessary for making the project eligible for federal funding.
- 8) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to comply and assist the RC in complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid transportation projects, including, but not limited to, all applicable requirements of 23 CFR 635.105.
- 9) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to ensure that the RC's work on the project would be deemed to meet the same standards that the Nebraska Department of Roads must meet under 23 CFR 635.105.
- 10) It will comply with the conflict-of-interest requirements of 23 CFR 1.33.
- 11) It will notify NDOR immediately in the event the designated RC(s) will no longer be assigned to the project. **A resolution designating a replacement RC may be required by NDOR.**
- 12) It is ultimately responsible for complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid highway projects. This includes meeting all post-construction environmental commitments. The LPA understands that failure to meet any eligibility requirements for federal funding may result in the loss of all Federal funding for the project. In the event that the acts or omissions of the RC, the LPA or its agents or representatives result in a finding that a project is ineligible for Federal funding, the LPA will be required to repay NDOR some or all previously paid Federal funds and any costs or expenses NDOR has incurred for the project, including but not limited to, those costs for the RC.

Gage County understands that the following are the duties of the RC:

- a) Serve as the LPA's contact for issues or inquiries for Federal-aid projects assigned by the LPA;
- b) Ensure that all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations,

- policies and guidelines are followed during the development and construction of the project;
- c) Know and follow the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects;
 - d) Have active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making;
 - e) Ensure that the project plans and specifications are sealed, signed and dated by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska, and that estimates have been prepared and the construction has been observed by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska or a person under the direct supervision of a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska (reference Neb. Rev. Stat. §81-3445);
 - f) Competently manage and coordinate the project day-to-day operations, including all project-related decisions, on behalf of the LPA, which includes the LPA's governing body, staff and any extended staff dedicated to the project such as consulting engineers;
 - g) Ensure that project documents are thoroughly checked, reviewed and have had quality control measures applied, prior to submitting to NDOR and/or FHWA;
 - h) Monitor the progress and schedule of the project and be responsible for ensuring that the project is completed on time in accordance with established milestone dates;
 - i) Properly serve as the owner's representative, and to visit the project site during construction on a frequency commensurate with the magnitude and complexity of the project;
 - j) Ensure that proper construction management processes have been developed and implemented for the project;
 - k) Serve as a steward of the public funds, i.e. ensure that the public gets what it is paying for;
 - l) Attend all required training including the annual workshop; and
 - m) Fulfill continuing education requirements as specified in the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects.

RESOLUTION **(DESIGNATING RC)**

Gage County, Nebraska
Resolution No. 10-25

Whereas: Gage County has a full-time public employee on staff, or has obtained the services of a full-time public employee who is fully qualified and has the time and interest in serving as a “Responsible Charge” (RC) for this project. The designated RC will be in day-to-day responsible charge of all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, with the express purpose of doing all the things necessary for the project to remain eligible for federal-aid transportation project funding; and

Whereas: the RC will ensure that, at a minimum, (1) the project receives independent and careful development, supervision and inspection, (2) the project is constructed in compliance with the plans and specifications, (3) all aspects of the project, from planning through construction activities, including all environmental commitments, remain eligible for federal funding, and (4) decisions made and ac-



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tions taken for the project have adequate supporting documentation filed in an organized fashion.

For the purposes of this resolution, the following definitions will apply:

Fully qualified means a person who has satisfactorily completed all applicable Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) training courses and who has met the other requirements necessary to be included on the NDOR list of qualified Local Public Agency (LPA) RC's.

Full-time public employee means a public employee who meets all the requirements and is afforded all the benefits of full-time employees as that phrase is applied to other employees of the employing public entity. A person is not a full-time public employee if that person provides outside private consulting services, or is employed by any private entity, unless that person can prove to NDOR in advance, that employee's non-public employment is in a field unrelated to any aspect of the project for which federal aid is sought.

Public employee means a person who is employed solely by a county, a municipality, a political subdivision; a Native American tribe; a school district; another entity that is either designated by statute as public or quasi-public; or an entity included on the list of entities as determined by the NDOR, and approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), as fulfilling public or quasi-public functions.

Responsible charge means the public employee who is fully empowered by the LPA and has actual day-to-day working knowledge and responsibility for all decisions related to all aspects of the federal-aid project from planning through construction project activities, including all environmental commitments. The RC is the day-to-day project manager, and the LPA's point-of-contact for the project. Responsible charge does not mean merely delegating the various tasks; it means active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, making decisions, and actively monitoring project construction. It is understood that the RC may delegate or contract certain technical tasks associated with the project so long as the RC actively manages and represents the owner's interests in the delegated technical tasks.

Be It Resolved: by the Board of Supervisors of Gage County that:

Marlin Kliwer, Highway Superintendent and Galen Engel, Assistant Highway Superintendent are hereby designated as Responsible Charge's (RC's) for pre-construction phases, in accordance with the Project Program Agreement previously executed, the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects, and all Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines for the following Federal-aid transportation project:

NDOR Project Number BR-3285(5),
NDOR Control Number 12300,
Filley North.



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Gage County assures and agrees that:

- 1) It has authorized and fully empowered the RC to be in day-to-day responsible charge of the subject federal-aid project; this does not mean merely supervising, overseeing or delegating the various tasks, it means active day-to-day involvement in the project including identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making.
- 2) The RC is a full-time public employee.
- 3) The RC is fully qualified and has successfully completed required training to serve as a RC.
- 4) It will allow the RC to spend all time reasonably necessary to properly discharge all duties associated with the project, including ensuring that all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, remain eligible for federal-aid highway project funding.
- 5) It will not assign other duties to the RC that would affect his or her ability to properly carry out the duties set out in this agreement.
- 6) It will provide necessary office space, materials and administrative support for the RC.
- 7) It will fully cooperate with, support and not unreasonably interfere with the day-to-day control of the RC concerning the acts necessary for making the project eligible for federal funding.
- 8) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to comply and assist the RC in complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid transportation projects, including, but not limited to, all applicable requirements of 23 CFR 635.105.
- 9) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to ensure that the RC's work on the project would be deemed to meet the same standards that the Nebraska Department of Roads must meet under 23 CFR 635.105.
- 10) It will comply with the conflict-of-interest requirements of 23 CFR 1.33.
- 11) It will notify NDOR immediately in the event the designated RC(s) will no longer be assigned to the project. **A resolution designating a replacement RC may be required by NDOR.**
- 12) It is ultimately responsible for complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid highway projects. This includes meeting all post-construction environmental commitments. The LPA understands that failure to meet any eligibility requirements for federal funding may result in the loss of all Federal funding for the project. In the event that the acts or omissions of RC, the LPA or its agents or representatives result in a finding that a project is ineligible for Federal funding, the LPA will be required to repay NDOR some or all previously paid Federal funds and any costs or expenses NDOR has incurred for the project, including but not limited to, those costs for the RC.

Gage County understands that the following are the duties of the RC:

- a) Serve as the LPA's contact for issued or inquiries for Federal-aid projects assigned by the LPA;
- b) Ensure that all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines are followed during the development and construction of the project;
- c) Know and follow the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid



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Projects;

- d) Have active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making;
- e) Ensure that the project plans and specifications are sealed, signed and dated by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska, and that estimates have been prepared and the construction has been observed by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska or a person under the direct supervision of a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska (reference Neb. Rev. Stat. §81-3445);
- f) Competently manage and coordinate the project day-to-day operations, including all project-related decisions, on behalf of the LPA, which includes the LPA's governing body, staff and any extended staff dedicated to the project such as consulting engineers;
- g) Ensure that project documents are thoroughly checked, reviewed and have had quality control measures applied, prior to submitting to NDOR and/or FHWA;
- h) Monitor the progress and schedule of the project and be responsible for ensuring that the project is completed on time in accordance with established milestone dates;
- i) Properly serve as the owner's representative, and to visit the project site during construction on a frequency commensurate with the magnitude and complexity of the project;
- j) Ensure that proper construction management processes have been developed and implemented for the project;
- k) Serve as a steward of the public funds, i.e. ensure that the public gets what it is paying for;
- l) Attend all required training including the annual workshop; and
- m) Fulfill continuing education requirements as specified in the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects.

RESOLUTION #10-40

RESOLUTION (DESIGNATING RC)

Gage County, Nebraska
Resolution No. 10-40

Whereas: Gage County has a full-time public employee on staff, or has obtained the services of a full-time employee who is fully qualified and has the time and interest in serving as a "Responsible Charge" (RC) for this project. The designated RC will be in day-to-day responsible charge of all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, with the express purpose of doing all things necessary for the project to remain eligible for federal-aid transportation project funding; and

Whereas: the RC will ensure that, at a minimum, (1) the project receives indepen-



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dent and careful development, supervision and inspection, (2) the project is constructed in compliance with the plans and specifications, (3) all aspects of the project, from planning through construction activities, including all environmental commitments, remain eligible for federal funding, and (4) decisions made and actions taken for the project have adequate supporting documentation filed in an organized fashion.

For purposes of this resolution, the following definitions will apply:

Fully qualified means a person who has satisfactorily completed all applicable Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) training courses and who has met the other requirements necessary to be included on the NDOR list of qualified Local Public Agency (LPA) RC's.

Full-time public employee means a public employee who meets all the requirements and is afforded all the benefits of full-time employees as that phrase is applied to other employees of the employing public entity. A person is not a full-time public employee if that person provides outside private consulting services, or is employed by any private entity, unless that person can prove to NDOR in advance, that employee's non-public employment is in a field unrelated to any aspect of the project for which federal aid is sought.

Public employee means a person who is employed solely by a county, a municipality, a political subdivision; a Native American tribe; a school district; another entity that is either designated by statute as public or quasi-public; or an entity included on the list of entities determined by the NDOR, and approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), as fulfilling public or quasi-public functions.

Responsible charge means the public employee who is fully empowered by the LPA and has actual day-to-day working knowledge and responsibility for all decisions related to all aspects of the federal-aid project planning through construction project activities, including all environmental commitments. The RC is the day-to-day project manager, and the LPA's point-of-contact for the project. Responsible charge does not mean merely delegating the various tasks; it means active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, making decisions, and actively monitoring project construction. It is understood that the RC may delegate or contract certain technical tasks associated with the project so long as the RC actively manages and represents the owner's interests in the delegated technical tasks.

Be It Resolved: by the Board of Supervisors of Gage County that:

Galen Engel, Highway Superintendent is hereby designated as Responsible Charge (RC) for pre-construction and construction phases, in accordance with the Project Program Agreement previously executed, the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects, and all Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines for the following Federal-aid transportation project:

NDOR Project Number STPE-BR-3265(4),

NDOR Control Number 11524,



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Barneston South.

Gage County Assures and agrees that:

- 1) It has authorized and fully empowered the RC to be in day-to-day responsible charge of the subject federal-aid project; this does not mean merely supervising, overseeing or delegating the various tasks, it means active day-to-day involvement in the project including identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making.
- 2) The RC is a full-time public employee.
- 3) The RC is fully qualified and has successfully completed required training to serve as a RC.
- 4) It will allow the RC to spend all time reasonably necessary to properly discharge all duties associated with the project, including ensuring that all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, remain eligible for federal-aid highway project funding.
- 5) It will not assign other duties to the RC that would affect his or her ability to properly carry out the duties set out in this agreement.
- 6) It will provide necessary office space, materials and administrative support for the RC.
- 7) It will fully cooperate with, support and not unreasonably interfere with the day-to-day control of the RC concerning the acts necessary for making the project eligible for federal funding.
- 8) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to comply and assist the RC in complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid transportation projects, including, but not limited to, all applicable requirements of 23 CFR 635.105.
- 9) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to ensure that the RC's work on the project would be deemed to meet the same standards that the Nebraska Department of Roads must meet under 23 CFR 635.105.
- 10) It will comply with the conflict-of-interest requirements of 23 CFR 1.33.
- 11) It will notify NDOR immediately in the event the designated RC(s) will no longer be assigned to the project. **A resolution designating a replacement RC may be required by NDOR.**
- 12) It is ultimately responsible for complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid highway projects. This includes meeting all post-construction environmental commitments. The LPA understands that failure to meet any eligibility requirements for federal funding may result in the loss of all Federal funding for the project. In the event that the acts or omissions of RC, the LPA or its agents or representatives result in a finding that a project is ineligible for Federal funding, the LPA will be required to repay NDOR some or all previously paid Federal funds and any costs or expenses NDOR has incurred for the project, including but not limited to, those costs for the RC.

Gage County understands that the following are the duties of the RC:

- a) Serve as the LPA's contact for issues or inquiries for Federal-aid projects assigned by the LPA;
- b) Ensure that all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines are followed during the development



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- and construction of the project;
- c) Know and follow the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects;
- d) Have active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making;

Whereas: The Hazard Elimination Program is a “core safety program” for Highway Safety Construction. This program is provided for in *Title 23, Section 148 of U.S. Code*, and is part of the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) which is provided for in *23 CFR, Part 924*, which is administered by the Federal Highway Administration,

Whereas: The State of Nebraska maintains a Multi-Disciplinary High Risk Rural Road Committee to oversee facets of the HSIP,

Whereas: The High Risk Rural Road Committee has determined that it is desirable to provide work zone and or road closure traffic control devices for use on rural county roads to prevent or minimize vehicle crashes in the State of Nebraska,

Whereas: The High Risk Rural Road Committee on September 14, 2010 approved a project known as HRRR-STWD(108) – Work Zone and Road Closure Traffic Control Devices to accomplish the following:

For the purchase and distribution, by the State of Nebraska Department of Roads, of Work Zone and Road Closure Traffic Control Devices for use by Counties on rural roads throughout the State of Nebraska.

Be It Resolved: That the State of Nebraska is hereby requested to act on behalf of said County to program a project for the purchase of traffic control devices shown on Exhibit “A” (Response Form) attached,

Be It Further Resolved: That sufficient funds of said county are now available or will be made available and are hereby pledged to the Nebraska Department of Roads in the amount and at the required time for the purpose of matching Federal funds for the contemplated construction.

The cost to said County is 10% of the work described herein which is estimated to be \$82.40 per set of single lane closure traffic control devices and \$80.40 per set of six Type III barricades and signs to fully close a road. Number of sets of each ordered is shown on Exhibit A attached to this resolution.

Be It Further Resolved: That the Chairman of the County Board is



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authorized to sign this Resolution on behalf of said Board. In addition the Chairman and the Highway Superintendent are hereby authorized to sign the Certificate of Compliance after completion of the work.

Modifications to Gage County Employee Handbook

WHEREAS, Gage County has an employee handbook that expressly states that it “does not constitute a contract between the Board and the County employees.”

WHEREAS, the Gage County Employee Handbook provides: “The Board retains the right to modify or abolish these policies, procedures, and benefits and reserves the right to adopt new policies, procedures, and benefits.”

WHEREAS, the Gage County Employee Handbook provides: “The County, like the employee, is free to terminate the employment relationship at any time with or without notice, for any or no reason as we are an ‘at will’ employer.”

WHEREAS, the Gage County Employee Handbook provides for the use of a grievance board for appeals of a corrective action (suspension or discharge only) and the grievance board consists of six people, two elected officials which may include chief deputies of the elected officials and department heads, two members of the Board of Supervisors, and two non-union employees;

WHEREAS, the Gage County Employee Handbook provides that a decision to suspend or terminate an employee by the elected County Board of Supervisors may be overturned by the grievance board which may include a majority of members who are non-elected officials, including chief deputies of elected officials and department heads and other County employees who may be supervised by the employee who has filed the appeal.

THEREFORE, LET IT NOW BE RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of Gage County by this resolution, takes the following official actions:

1. The “Grievance Procedure” in the Gage County Employee Handbook is rescinded effective today as to any Gage County employee subject to appointment or hiring by the Gage County Board of Supervisors.
2. The “Discipline and Discharge” policy in the Gage County Employee Handbook is modified effective today to no longer allow an employee appointed or hired by the Gage County Board of Supervisors to file a grievance as outlined in the “Grievance Procedure” of a suspension with pay, suspension without pay, or termination of employment.
3. This Resolution should be distributed by the Gage County Clerk to all current Gage County employees subject to disciplinary action by the Gage County Board of Supervisors.
